## WHO WE ARE

Edinburgh Tenants Federation (ETF) was launched in 1990 and is formally recognised by the City of Edinburgh Council (CEC) as the negotiating body for CEC tenants.

ETF is a membership-based organisation that is run by and for our membership. Tenants' and Residents' Groups join the Federation, elect the committee members, set the work plans and decide policies. Individual tenants can also join as non-voting associate members.

ETF is led by volunteers but employ a dedicated staff team to assist in the development of services. In 2018, ETF changed its legal status and became a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (SCIO). Becoming a SCIO brings new opportunities to ETF, such as new avenues for funding.



## WHAT WE DO

ETF support local groups in their work by providing information, advice and training to assist them to further develop and achieve their goals. ETF's staff and committee members have considerable experience of:

- Working to set up local groups;
- Providing information, advice and support;
- Assisting groups in networking with others;
- Working in partnership to influence policies, services and standards.

## HOW WE WORK

ETF members elect an Executive Committee (EC) that meet regularly and take responsibility for the day-to-day running of the Federation. Four members' meetings are held each year which any member can attend and influence major policy decisions and our future work priorities. As well as formal meetings, ETF holds social and other events throughout the year to provide more informal opportunities for tenants to exchange views, advice and experience.

ETF has specific forums to deal with ongoing tenant priorities, such as:

- Repairs;
- Rents;
- High Rise Flats;
- Sheltered Housing;
- Tenant Led Inspections.

All interested tenants are welcome to participate in these forums.

ETF keeps members and supporters informed of Federation activities in a number of ways:

- Bi-monthly newsletter;
- Monthly e-newsletter;
- *Tenants Voice* Magazine, published three times per year;
- Website;
- Facebook;
- Twitter.

## HOW WE CAN HELP YOU
